Vezhdi Rashidov (1951)

Extremely rare and elegant sculpture in bronze with a beautiful green patina on a base made of black marble depicting a standing male figure

Artist: Vezhdi Letif Rashidov, a Bulgarian sculptor born in 1951 Graduated from the National Academy of Arts, Sofia in 1978

Rashidov is a recipient of many distinguished awards for his statuettes as well as for his large-scale works. In addition to being a sculptor, Rashidov is a prominent social figure and outspoken critic of the Movement for Rights and Freedom.

He became the first non-Movement for Rights and Freedom candidate in many years to be elected to parliament from that constituency.

His political party, GERB (Citizens for European Development of Bulgaria), overwelmingly won the last election and are the ruling party. Rashidov was appointed Minister of Culture.

This interesting sculpture is a great conversation piece and will easily fit in a variety of interior design projects, antique or contemporary.
